# **Continue to Learn with LINC**

The Leadership for INClusion in the Early Years (LINC) Consortium is proud to present the CPD for INCOs continuing professional development (CPD) programme aimed at graduates of its Level 6 Special Purpose Award. A qualification designed to support early childhood teachers in leading and creating inclusive early learning and care (ELC) settings, where all children are enabled to flourish and achieve their potential.



Aims of the CPD Programme:

- To equip participants in their role as INCOs with the requisite knowledge(s), practices and values to lead inclusion in early learning and care (ELC) settings and to support the implementation of the Better Start Access and Inclusion Model (AIM).
- To offer participants strategies and supports to enable them to respond appropriately to ensure that all children can access and fully participate in ELC settings.
- To support participants in developing family, professional and community partnerships that contribute to the creation of inclusive ELC settings.
- To support participants in the development of Communities of Practice that provide fora for ELC practitioners to create inclusive ELC settings.

The LINC Consortium is led by Mary Immaculate College (MIC), and includes Early Childhood Ireland and Maynooth University-Froebel Department of Primary and Early Childhood Education.

#### **PROGRAMME STRUCTURE**

LINC+ is open to all graduates of the LINC Level 6 Programme and consists of six 10 hour continuing professional development packages. So far **three packages are available.** The first package, Communities of Practice in Early Learning and Care, must be completed by all participants. They can then choose whichever package they wish to engage with i.e. once they have completed package 1 they can choose to complete either package 2 or package 3. Package 1 will commence in **October** 2022.



The content for the CPD programme will only be available online and will be hosted on Moodle. Moodle will be familiar to graduates of the original Level 6 Special Purpose Award as it is the same system used for that programme. It will be up to each individual participant to take it upon themselves to complete the package content. Participants can engage with the material at a time that suits them. Similar to the Level 6 programme, there is no fee to take part in the CPD for INCOs Programme. Participants will receive a certificate of completion that they will be able to download once they complete each package.




#### REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS
